B. NEW BUSINESS

1. Disability Inclusive Transportation – Assessment of First/Last Mile Conditions in the Richmond Region

Rebekah Cazares highlighted the purpose of her study, which was to increase access to public transportation services in the Richmond region for individuals with disabilities. Examples of first and last mile barriers to public transit service were presented, along with estimates of the disability demographics in the region. All 240 census tracts in the region were analyzed with regard to their accessibility to transit, and a detailed case study was undertaken of a census tract having a high score on factors that limit access to transit. Recommendations to address first/last mile barriers to accessing transit were developed, along with a proposed implementation timeline.

2. Virtual Tour of the VDOT Richmond District Traffic Operations Center

Ed Correa of VDOT reviewed various aspects of the planning, construction and operation of a new Traffic Operations Center at the VDOT Richmond District Complex. In addition to reviewing the timeline for the design and construction of the facility, Mr. Correa noted some of the challenges encountered, the benefits of the facility and the number of traffic incidents, work zones, and weather events monitored and managed by the center during calendar year 2020.

Kelli Rowan of the City of Richmond Office of Equitable Transit and Mobility provided an overview of "Path to Equity", a policy guide for the Richmond Connects equitable mobility and accessibility plan. Ms. Rowan noted that

efforts to engage the community in the planning process had included popup events and an on-going survey. To encourage participation, the City has arranged for a food truck to be present at upcoming survey events, and individuals completing the survey are given vouchers for free food.


