1. Attendance

LRTP Project Manager Dorian Allen welcomed everyone and asked each person to put their name and affiliation in the chat.

2. May 27, 2026, LRTP-AWG Meeting Summary

Dorian informed the group that a summary of the meeting was included within the agenda packet.

There were no amendments to the meeting summary.

3. Public Comment Period

There were no requests to offer public comment.

4. LRTP Progress Update

Dorian presented a review of the condensed LRTP process flow with an overview and timeline for past and upcoming tasks.

5. LRTP Draft Document: Chapter 1-6 Review

Dorian presented information on the foundational framework, technical progress, and financial structure of the Transportation 2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan. The multi-year planning process, initiated in 2022 and scheduled for final adoption in September 2026, coordinates performance-driven investments across nine member jurisdictions.

Dorian then went on state that the development of the Transportation 2050 Long-Range Transportation Plan (LRTP) is currently in its final stages, with adoption by the RRTPO Policy Board scheduled for the fall of 2026. Following the April 2026 adoption of the consensus investment package, the planning process has shifted toward finalizing the draft document. Key upcoming milestones include the dissemination of Draft Chapter 7 for review, the incorporation of feedback from the Advisory Workgroup, and a formal 30-day public review period in August 2026. Dorian emphasized that these steps were made to ensure the plan reflects community input before its final approval.

6. LRTP Draft Document – Plan Evaluation Review/Completion Timeline

Myles Busching presented information on LRTP Chapter 7: Plan Evaluation. The overview highlighted the utilization of performance-based scenario planning across Low, Medium, and High growth futures to evaluate the robustness of the consensus project set. Myles noted that the evaluation was also grounded in Title VI and the Virginia Environmental Justice Act, highlighting that 33.7% (\$1.63 billion) of the plan's base cost is allocated to projects within Equity Emphasis Areas.

7. Plan Evaluation - Policy Recommendations

Dorian described how key policy recommendations were established to integrate land use with housing, formalize a Congestion Management Process hierarchy, fully incorporate vision networks, and standardize interregional modeling with neighboring planning agencies:

- **Unified Land Use Planning:** Adopt integrated forecasting models to evaluate land use, housing, and transportation collectively, ensuring infrastructure investments reinforce housing affordability.
- **Planning for Deep Uncertainty:** Expand exploratory scenario planning utilizing advanced modeling tools, such as VisionEval and TMIP-EMAT, to stress-test projects against unpredictable future macro-trends.
- **CMP Solutions Hierarchy:** Formalize a strict Congestion Management Process hierarchy requiring project sponsors to exhaust land-use, operational, and multimodal solutions before qualifying for capacity expansions.
- **Vision Network Continuity:** Develop stable project guidelines and a standardized regional definition of "major roads" to ensure multimodal networks remain prioritized across plan updates.
- **Interregional Modeling Alignment:** Partner with adjacent jurisdictions to coordinate socioeconomic data horizons and standardize modeling assumptions along borders.

Dorian then laid out next steps which included a review by the AWG with feedback and further refinement, where necessary.

8. Next Meeting

Dorian informed the AWG that the next meeting will be held on July 22, 10AM virtually.
