**1. Attendance**

L RTP Project Manager Dorian Allen welcomed everyone and asked that all Advisory Work Group Members record their respective names and affiliations in the Zoom chat to record attendance.

**2. December 3, 2025, LRTP-AWG Meeting Summary**

The ninth LRTP Advisory Workgroup meeting was held on December 3, 2025. Dorian informed the group that the summary of the meeting was included within the agenda packet.

There were no amendments to the meeting summary.

**3. Public Comment Period**

There were no requests to offer public comment.

**4. LRTP Progress Update**

Dorian presented a review of the condensed LRTP process flow with an overview and timeline for past and upcoming tasks.

Dorian then focused on an update regarding constrained plan development. He stated that the LRTP is federally required to be fiscally constrained, which means that the project list includes only projects for which reasonably expected revenues are identified.

Dorian presented a forecast of revenues between the years of 2026 out to 2050. He noted that the region would have about \$32 billion in projected revenue by 2050. He stated that certain categories will be funded as the first cut, such as operations and local projects. He stated that after this is taken into consideration the funding for regional projects is the remainder.

For funding the regional projects, he stated that the proposed approach this time is to develop four investment options for AWG and public to review – Efficiency (benefit per dollar invested), Benefit (most impactful projects), Mode Shift (reflects adopted objectives), and Business-As-Usual (reflects existing trends and reflects cost-benefit funding processes).

Dorian stated that the investment options will be presented to the public for feedback. He showed a conceptual approach for sharing the information with the public and noted the types of questions that would be asked to prompt public input.

The Advisory Workgroup did not have any comments or questions on this item.

**5. LRTP Phase 5: Universe of Projects – Update**

Dorian presented information on changes in the Universe of Projects, listing revisions, additions, and noting some duplicate projects were removed. He showed the

breakdown of project types, project numbers within each, and total project costs. The total is over nine billion dollars.

Dorian then talked about the next steps, including project scoring, investment scenario performance evaluation, and preferred scenario performance evaluation.

The Advisory Workgroup did not have any comments or questions.

## **6. LRTP Phase 6: Project Prioritization Methodology – Update**

Dorian provided an update on the scoring methodology and displayed the updated performance measure scorecard. He went through comments and concerns that had been received from the AWG and how they were accounted for in the project prioritization process. These included safety, environment, air quality, and Smartscale consistency topics. Dorian expressed appreciation for the comments received. He noted that the document will be updated to address areas where information and clarity is needed to address the comments. He stated that the performance measures would remain as previously presented.

Myles echoed appreciation for AWG comments and noted how useful they had been in revising the project prioritization document. He noted that the performance measures shown are what is feasible given 200 projects to score. He said that he welcomed input on the weighting of the categories shown on the scorecard.

Mitch Huber asked a question about safety measures and weighting. He noted that safety measures were focused on cars and would like to see pedestrian safety accounted for.

Dorian expressed thanks for the comment and stated that the team would work to explore this.

JJ Banuelos asked if the group were all in agreement with the 20% weighting for safety.

Ashley Austin stated that she would like to see the safety weighting be higher.

Myles noted that input on where to decrease the percentage in the other categories is also helpful.

Ashley stated her input would be to reduce reliability or sustainability.

Mitch asked about the placement of access to jobs and services under the sustainability category.

Myles provided information about the thought process of this category fitting under sustainability, based on the goal and objective language.

Dorian and Myles noted that the updated scorecard and process information will be brought back at the next meeting, along with the draft scorecards for each project.

The Advisory Workgroup did not have any further comments or questions on this item.

## **7. Next Meeting**

Dorian noted that the next regular meeting date would fall on the last Wednesday in February (25<sup>th</sup>) and that he would follow up with a meeting invite soon.
