FRA Amtrak Long Distance Study

FRA has released the draft document for its Amtrak Long Distance Study for public comment through March 8, 2024. Of significance for Virginia is a proposed route of a New York City to Houston route with travel through Roanoke and Bristol. A copy of the FRA presentation is available here for review.

Federal Transit Administration announces two NOFOs

FTA has announced the opportunity to apply for \$1,103,963,762 in competitive grants under the Low or No Emission Grant Program (Low-No Program) and



\$390,045,823 under the Grants for Buses and Bus Facilities Competitive Program (Buses and Bus Facilities Program). <u>View the NOFOs here.</u>

The purpose of the Low-No Program is to support the transition of the nation's transit fleet to the lowest polluting and most energy efficient transit vehicles. The Low-No Program provides funding to state and local governmental authorities for the purchase or lease of zero-emission and low-emission transit buses, including acquisition, construction, and leasing of required supporting facilities.

The purpose of the Buses and Bus Facilities Competitive Program is to assist in the financing of buses and bus facilities capital projects, including replacing, rehabilitating, purchasing or leasing buses or related equipment, and rehabilitating, purchasing, constructing or leasing bus-related facilities.

Clean Bus Planning Awards

The \$5 million <u>Clean Bus Planning Awards (CBPA) program</u>, managed by the National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) and funded by the Joint Office, <u>launched last week</u>. The CBPA program provides free technical assistance from NREL to create comprehensive and customized bus electrification plans for fleets across the United States. Both public transit agencies and school bus fleet operators are eligible to apply.
