


Recommendation Priority Summary

- Fund FY2022 with FY2021 CVTA Dollars (Proj. \$20.3 MM)
 - Maintain Existing Service (\$20,000,000)
 - Capital Local Match (\$633,000)
 - Micro transit Study (\$200,000)
 - FY2023 Regional Public Transportation Plan (\$200,000)
 - Continue prioritization for service expansion
- FY2022 CVTA Dollars into Reserve for FY2023 (Proj. \$28.8MM)

CVTA Funding Priority 1 — Maintain Existing Service

- Current System
 - Regional
 - Essential
- CVTA Funding Estimate FY2022: \$20M






CVTA Funding Priority 2 — Capital Projects

- Provide 2% of Local Match for Grants
- Reserve for Large Capital Projects
 - Fleet Replacement and Expansion
 - Neighborhood Transfer Centers
 - 23rd and Franklin, Southside Plaza, Willow Lawn, Chamberlayne and Wilmer
 - Downtown Transit Center


CVTA Funding Priority 3 — Micro mobility Study

- Explore micro mobility services that would complement the Fixed Route system
- This service could operate as first/mile last mile for areas that do not have the density or demand to support fixed route such as rural jurisdictions
- CVTA Funding Estimate FY2022: \$200,000





CVTA Funding Priority 4 — Prioritized Expansion


- Continuing to prioritize expansion from the full list developed with the core design group
- Expansion is limited on available operators, vehicles, COVID recovery, and CVTA funds
 - Minimal expansion projected for FY2022
- Available FY2022 CVTA Funds for Expansion and Micro mobility: \$6 - \$7M
- FY2023 Plan \$200,000





- Extend Route 1c to Brook/Parham
- Extend Route 3 to Laburnum and Route 3a to Azalea
- Route 5 to 10 minutes, consolidate Route 77 into 5a
- New Route 7c for 15 minute frequency on Route 7 from Laburnum to downtown
- Fold Route 111 into Route 3b
 - Sunday service, and span improvements
- Route 86 extended to Chesterfield
- New Route 84 to Wilkinson Terrace
- Route 85 to Chesterfield Gov't Center
- Extend Route 1 a to Chesterfield Towne Center
- Routes 18/79 increased to 30 minute frequency, extended to create West End Loop
 - Weekend service and span improvements
- Route 29x to Innsbrook
- Route 19 increased to 20 minute frequency


