Alliance Committees

The Alliance is comprised of five, distinct standing committees: Mass Care & Human Services, Outreach, Regional CERT, Planning, and Training & Exercise. These committees are led by a Chair and co-Chair who work with PlanRVA staff to facilitate meetings, apply for grants, and organize regional projects and initiatives.

Mass Care & Human Services

The MCHS Committee provides opportunity for those at the local level, responsible for Mass Care and Human Services actions during emergencies, to collaborate on:

- Funding opportunities
- Training and exercise
- Enhancing capabilities through material supply purchases
- Benefit from the sharing of best practices and strengthen capacity by exploring ways of solving challenges faced during prior events.

Outreach

The Outreach Committee organizes public and professional outreach events to share preparedness education with the community, in addition to engaging the professional community on the Alliance's resources and benefits. Other activities include:

- Partnered with the Flying Squirrels (local baseball Team) to promote community preparedness
- Developed outreach materials such as the <u>Regional Preparedness Guide</u>
- Supported Business Preparedness initiatives

Regional CERT

The CERT Committee provides training and exercise opportunities for CERT programs within the region, as well as a regional forum for sharing best practices. Projects and activities include:

- Regional Stop the Bleed Classes
- Regional CERT skills rodeo
- Damage assessment classes
- Numerous workshops and guest presentation opportunities

Planning

The Planning Committee supports Alliance participants with statutory and/or grant mandated planning requirements. Its work addresses emerging trends and policies which will impact emergency management. The Committee meets these objectives through the development of plans, planning frameworks, research & guidance, and through multi-year projects. Examples of some projects and products of the Planning Committee include:

- Richmond/Crater Multi Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan
- Threat & Hazard Identification and Risk Assessment (THIRA)
- Regional Family Assistance Center (FAC)
- Joint Information Center (JIC) planning frameworks and workshops.
- Recovery Planning frameworks, workshops, and exercises for local governments, non-profits, and the private sector.



Training & Exercise

The Training and Exercise Committee provides regional support through:

- Exercise Equipment
- Exercise staff assistance
- Building cadre of Subject Matter Experts
- Maintain a regional calendar of training and exercises
- Provides weekly training updates/opportunities to membership

Alliance Executive Committee

The Chair, Vice Chair, Secretary, and Finance Officer are elected on a yearly basis at the December regular meeting. These positions, regional representatives, and the committee chairs make up the Alliance Executive Committee. This group meets monthly to discuss Alliance executive business and strategic planning.
