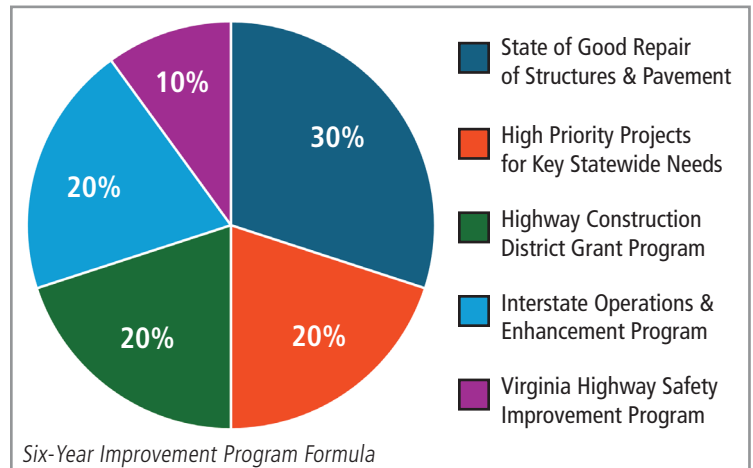


What is the Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP)? The Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) allocates revenue from dedicated state and federal sources to projects over a six-year period. The SYIP is a document that outlines planned spending for construction, development, or study over the upcoming six years.

What is the SYIP process? The CTB updates the SYIP each fiscal year. As revenue estimates are updated, new priorities are identified and existing projects advance. The fiscal year starts July 1 and ends June 30. After maintenance needs are funded, remaining construction funding is distributed according to a funding formula to the right.

How can I share input? Every year, public meetings are held in all nine districts in Virginia on project priorities and the SYIP.

Why should I attend? Public input is taken into consideration as the next update of the SYIP is drafted and presented to the CTB. The board considers all input before adopting the final program, typically in June.



Public Involvement Opportunities

Public meetings will be conducted in all nine construction districts to obtain input on projects being considered for funding through programs including Revenue Sharing, Safety, Transportation Alternatives, State of Good Repair, and other programs. Additionally, comments will be accepted for new projects valued at over \$25 million.

A draft of the upcoming SYIP will be available April 21, and proposed projects across all nine districts will be subject to comment. Dates for the 2026 public meetings are below. Meetings will be held at 4 p.m. with the exception of Northern Virginia, which will be held at 5 p.m.
