SMART SCALE - Round 5 (FY22 - FY27 SYIP)

- SMART SCALE Pre-Application Portal closed April 1 at 5 pm
- Received 106 pre-applications from Richmond District applicants; 12 of them are from the RRTPO and 5 from PlanRVA
 - Approx. 22% of statewide pre-applications (490 pre-applications statewide)
- Final application period anticipated to re-open in June and close early August
- As pre-applications are screened in prior to June, applicants will be notified that they can begin work on final applications
- Application refinement assistance is available through VDOT Richmond District Planning; email requests to <u>richmonddistrictsmartscale@VDOT.Virginia.gov</u>
- Richmond District Planning staff will be reaching out to every applicant to review their applications

SYIP Development

- <u>Development of the FY 2023-2028 Six-Year Improvement Program</u> is underway
- Richmond District Public Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, April 28 at the Richmond District Office
- The draft SYIP will be presented to the CTB in April and a final SYIP will be provided for CTB action at the June board meeting

The Fall Line

- VDOT Design-Build Packages
 - The CVTA approved funding the Design / Build Project Packages 1 & 2 (southern and northern sections); VDOT staff is currently working with localities and CVTA staff to create UPC's, program approved funding and initiate the necessary agreement
- Next Design Guidelines Stakeholder Meeting April 14 at 2 pm

Find out about the proposed location of the Fall Line Trail and alignment refinements to the corridor for a multi-use trail within Chesterfield, Hanover and Henrico counties, as well as the cities of Colonial Heights, Petersburg and Richmond, and the Town of Ashland.

Review meeting materials and give your input on the proposed Fall Line Trail alignment, extending from the City of Petersburg to the Town of Ashland. The alignment was initially identified in VDOT's February 2020 Ashland to Petersburg Trail Study. Since the completion of the study and the identification of the preferred corridor, a number of alignment refinements have been incorporated into the corridor.

Each meeting will be held in an open-house style format with no formal presentation given and attendees are encouraged to arrive at any time during the open-house window. VDOT representatives will be present to discuss the alignment and answer questions.
