CERTIFICATION OF QUORUM

Barbara K. Smith, TAC Chairman, called the March 10, 2020 Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

1. Approval of Meeting Agenda

There were no requests to amend the TAC meeting agenda and on motion of Liz McAdory, seconded by John O'Keefe, TAC unanimously approved the March 10, 2020 TAC meeting agenda.

2. Approval of February 11, 2020 TAC Meeting Minutes

On motion of Nora Amos, seconded by Liz McAdory, TAC unanimously approved the February 11, 2020 TAC minutes.

3. Open Public Comment Period There were no requests to address TAC.

4. TAC Chairman's Report

Chairman Smith had nothing to report.

5. RRTPO Update

Chet Parsons, RRTPO Secretary, reported as follows:

- a. Current Work Efforts These are included under agenda item 5.a.
- Themed "We'll Get You Moving" representing the focus on multi-modal transportation, the annual APA Virginia Chapter conference will be in Richmond July 19-21, 2020. Staff is working with the conference planning committee with a focus now on planning mobile workshops throughout the

region. Contact Chet Parsons (<u>cparsons@PlanRVA.org</u>) or Barbara Jacocks (<u>bjacocks@PlanRVA.org</u>) for more information.

- b. SMART SCALE Round 4: Regional Project Pre-Applications On March 5, the RRTPO policy board took action and approved a list of 12 candidate regional projects for Smart Scale Round 4 applications. VDOT's feedback is expected to help staff make a recommendation to the policy board in terms of which 10 projects will go to the full application process. The list of candidate projects can be found on pages 7-8 in the March 10 agenda packet.
- c. ConnectRVA 2045 Outreach Update Chet Parsons demonstrated the use of the <u>ConnectRVA 2045 Needs Assessment</u> webpage. The interactive Wikimap allows adding of corridors or nodes where transportation issues are experienced. Additionally, information can be shared using the LRTP Comment Form and sending feedback about a shared vision for the ideal transportation system.
- d. Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside Project Selections Update:
 - Three CTB selections changed since TAC approved the allocation of FY21-FY22 Transportation Alternatives Set-Aside funding on February 11, 2020. The following selections were assigned funds to by the CTB members:
 - 2nd/3rd St bike infrastr (phase II) in the City of Richmond
 - Tredegar St transportation project in the City of Richmond
 - Lakeside Community trail (phase I) in Henrico
- e. Legislative Update As of March 4th, <u>HB 1541</u> was signed by the Speaker of the House and by the President of the Senate. Next, the bill goes to Governor Ralph Northam's desk. The latest <u>2020 Fiscal Impact Statement</u> shows estimated revenue impacts in the amount of \$179M - \$207M generated to the fund between 2021 and 2026. RRTPO is named in the language of the bill regarding the 15% transit allocation. Staff started working with GRTC to talk about the Transit Development Plan as well as having the planning in place to support the authority.

6. Vision Zero Work Group

Chet Parsons gave a summary on formation of the Vision Zero Work Group from the February 6, 2020 RRTPO policy board meeting. 7. TIP Amendment GRTC00000 Expansion – Articulated Vehicles

Myles Busching informed the committee that the RRTPO policy board has received a request from GRTC to amend the TIP to add a new project and purchase three articulated vehicles for expanding the Pulse's capacity. The project receives FTA state and local funds; no RRTPO funds are involved with this project. There were no questions or comments.

The resolution was presented for TAC review and recommendation to the RRTPO policy board for approval.

On motion of Adrienne Torres, seconded by Tiffany Dubinsky, the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) voted unanimous approval of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization policy board amends the *FY18 – FY21 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP)* adding the following new project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this project is considered exempt from conformity under provisions contained in section 93.126 of the conformity rule as follows:

 UPC GRTC00000: Expansion Vehicles – Articulated Vehicles – GRTC Transit System. FTA Section 5307 funds (FY21 \$672,000) will be used for this project; exempt under purchase of new buses and rail cars to replace existing vehicles or for minor expansions of the fleet.

8. FY21 – 26 RSTP/CMAQ New Project Prioritization

Myles Busching presented on the RSTBG program and the CMAQ program. Development of the SYIP is scheduled to occur later this year compared to recent years. The available RSTP and CMAQ funding for FY21 and projected funding for FY22 – FY26 are not yet available. Given these developments, VDOT has requested the TPO use a two-step approach to allocations for new projects this year. The first step is prioritizing projects for funding. All projects were evaluated using the criteria in the project selection guidelines by a scoring team of eight (8) people drawn from TPO staff, VDOT Richmond District staff, and DRPT staff. The Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality (CMAQ) program is a funding dedicated to improving air quality in region's that are not (or formerly were not) in attainment with national air quality standards. The Richmond region currently receives around \$8M each year in CMAQ funding. All of the projects were evaluated for potential reduction of ozone precursors with the help of VDOT's Environmental Division.

A discussion took place regarding prioritization, evaluation, and selection of projects for funding. Myles Busching (mbusching@PlanRVA.org) is available for questions regarding criteria used in evaluating and ranking proposed projects.

On motion of Barbara K. Smith, seconded by Liz McAdory, the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO) Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) voted unanimous approval for the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization policy board approves the prioritization of the following project to where it scored (Rank 4):

• Route 1 (Marina Drive - Merriewood Road) Shared-Use Path in Chesterfield County with a reduced funding request in the amount of \$414,000.

Current Work Efforts Update – Item 5.a.

ConnectRVA 2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan

Due to the ongoing and expanding threats related to COVID-19 (coronavirus), the LRTP Advisory Committee (LRTP-AC) meeting scheduled for March 26, 2020, was cancelled. Staff compiled a revised list of existing transportation issues based on regional and local studies, additional recommendations provided by LRTP-AC members and possible future transportation highway issues captured by Richmond/Tri-Cities Travel Demand Model. This spreadsheet was emailed to the LRTP-AC members on April 1. Public comments received through the ConnectRVA 2045 website and the community outreach meetings will be added to this list after we close the public outreach for transportation issue identification on April 15. The final "Transportation Needs List" based on comments provided by LRTP-AC members along with the added public comments will go through a 15-day public review period and will come back to the LRTP-AC members for their approval.

Trolley Line Trail Advisory Group

The Trolley Line Trail advisory group is working in concert with the VDOT Ashland to Petersburg Trail Study. The localities along the corridor continue to identify segments of independent utility along the conceptual 14-mile route from Ashland to the City of Richmond. Several of these segments are the subject of funding applications either through the Transportation Alternatives (TA) program or SMART SCALE. Staff continues to work with the advisory group and each of the localities.

Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Update

The story map of existing infrastructure, bike/ped features and statistics on bike/ped injuries and fatalities in the region has been completed and continues to be updated and enhanced with pertinent and new information. Staff has met with each locality to review their own priorities and future plans as a foundation for depicting a regional network supported by clear goals, objectives and measures of performance that define regional impact and establish a strategy for implementation. A shared drive and their own observations of travel and photos from around the region by bicycle or on foot. Staff has begun writing the document and will continue to update throughout the year as they proceed with this process.

Ashland Complete Streets Pilot Project

Complete Streets guidelines, or a "tool-box", depicted through graphic and photographic examples are being prepared as part of the regional bike/ped plan story map. These images are intended to show specific locations where good standards have been implemented and where infrastructure improvements could incorporate complete streets elements for better solutions throughout the region.

Active Transportation Work Group (ATWG)

Staff has begun planning for the regular quarterly meeting of the ATWG, tentatively scheduled for June 9, 2020. Staff participated in Henrico County's first Active Transportation work group, which is designed to advise the planning for a bicycle and pedestrian chapter of the county comprehensive plan. The group consists of Henrico

county staff, advocates and regional planners. The first meeting was held on March 12 and plans to meet monthly, with the next meeting scheduled as a virtual meeting on April 15.

American Planning Association-Virginia Chapter Annual Conference

Themed "We'll Get You Moving" representing the focus on multi-modal transportation, the <u>annual APA Virginia Chapter conference</u> will be in Richmond September 13-16, 2020. Staff continues to work with the conference planning committee now focusing on planning mobile workshops throughout the region.

SMART SCALE Round 4

The portal for the next round of <u>SMART SCALE</u> is open from the beginning of March and has been extended until April 17, 2020 for pre-application submissions by qualified applicants. Staff are working with member governments to prepare pre-application materials for our 10 (+2) allotted slots for regionally-significant projects. VDOT staff will pre-screen the applications and notify applicants of screening results. At that time, staff will work with TAC and the policy board to develop the final list of ten full applications for submission. The full application window runs from June until August 3, 2020.

FY21 – FY26 RSTP/CMAQ DRAFT ALLOCATIONS

Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization

REQUESTED ACTION: Review and recommendation to the RRTPO policy board of the FY21 - FY26 RSTP/CMAQ draft allocations.

BACKGROUND: Selecting and prioritizing projects for funding is one of the primary roles of the RRTPO in developing the regional transportation system. Projects selected by the TPO to receive funding are included in the Six-Year Improvement Program (SYIP) for adoption by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB).

At the March meeting, TAC voted on a prioritization of new RSTP and CMAQ projects. TPO staff has worked with VDOT Richmond District staff to develop a draft allocation program following the priorities recommended by TAC. The draft allocations take a new approach to programming funds which is more consistent with the approach taken by VDOT and draws on the approach of Hampton Roads TPO and Fredericksburg Area MPO.

For newly selected projects, funds are allocated to directly match the project schedule. For example, if a project is scheduled for two (2) years of PE and a flexible start year of FY23, the funds for PE will be programmed in FY23 with the next allocation for RW provided in FY25. In the case of more expensive phases or phases which last more than four (4) years, the funding may be split over two years. This approach to allocating funds is consistent with state requirements that RSTP and CMAQ funds be obligated within 12 months of allocation and expended within 36 months of obligation.

At the program level, allocations cover all six (6) years of the six-year program. In the past, allocations generally only covered the first outyear or two with significant balances of 20%-40% remaining for the later outyears. Under the new approach, a minimum of five percent (5%) balance is maintained for outyears to ensure funding is available should a project overrun the budget and to hedge against reductions in program funding. The remainder is allocated to projects and programs. Moving forward, any balance available in year one after cost overruns are processed will be available for immediate needs such as programs or studies which do not require any further funding commitments.

Beyond the six-year program, a table of future commitments has also been developed. Many projects have schedules which last more than a few years. To ensure funding is available for these projects, the needed allocations for future project phases by year is also documented. For future allocation cycles, this will allow TPO staff to easily estimate the available funding before the application period in the fall and to ensure funding is not oversubscribed for future phases.



DRAFT FFY 21 – 24 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP)

Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization

REQUESTED ACTION: Review the draft *FY21-FY24 Transportation Improvement Program* (TIP) and provide a recommendation to the RRTPO policy board.

BACKGROUND: The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is a federally mandated requirement (49 U.S.C. § 5303(j)) for all metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs). The TIP, also known as a short-range plan, lists all transportation projects in an MPO's metropolitan planning area that seek federal transportation funding within a four-year planning horizon. The TIP is complementary to the long-range transportation plan (LRTP), that plans on at least a twenty-year horizon. The TIP is required to be updated to coincide with the update of the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program (STIP). Staff has worked with VDOT, DRPT, GRTC, and human services providers to develop the project list and planned obligations for the TIP.

The draft TIP largely follows the organization of the current adopted TIP. The financial plan has been moved toward the front of the plan to better reflect the fiscal constraints on project selection. The ungrouped projects have been reorganized by system rather than jurisdiction to emphasize the regional, systems-approach to transportation planning. Within each system, projects are organized alphabetically by jurisdiction and then numerically by Universal Product Code (UPC), a number assigned by VDOT to track a project from start to finish. For transit projects, a STIP code is used in place of the UPC.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION: Consistent with the former Public Participation Plan, the RRTPO conducted a public comment period from February 18 through April 3, 2020. The comment period was advertised in the Richmond Free Press and Richmond Times Dispatch. The draft document was provided to local governments and transit agencies and made available online.

Due to the outbreak of COVID-19 and the social distancing guidance from the Virginia Department of Health and federal government, the scheduled open house on March 17th was cancelled. Project maps and comment forms were made available on the website and shared via social media and email to interested parties. No comments were received during the comment period. A summary of outreach efforts is included in an appendix to the TIP.

SELF-CERTIFICATION: In addition to adopting the TIP for the next four years, MPOs are required to adopt a resolution of self-certification to be submitted to FHWA and FTA concurrently with the TIP pursuant to federal regulation (23 CFR § 450.336). This self-certification, included in the resolution below, certifies compliance with federal law and regulations related to transportation planning.

TAC ACTION REQUESTED: The following resolution is presented for TAC review and recommendation to the RRTPO policy board for approval at the next opportunity to assemble a quorum and take action on non-emergency business:

RESOLVED, that the Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization policy board adopts the FY21-FY24 Transportation Improvement Program as presented.

FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Virginia Department of Transportation and the Richmond Area Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Richmond, Virginia Urbanized Area, hereby certifies that in accordance with 23 Code of Federal Regulations Part 450 Section 336 Self-certification and Federal certifications, the metropolitan transportation planning process is being carried out in accordance with all applicable requirements including:

- (1) 23 U.S.C. 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303 (Highways and Transit), and 23 CFR 450 subpart B Metropolitan Planning;
- (2) Sections 174 and 176(c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. 7504, 7506(c) and (d)) and 40 CFR part 93;
- (3) Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. 2000d-1) and 49 CFR part 21;
- (4) 49 U.S.C. 5332, prohibiting discrimination, on the basis of race, creed, national origin, sex or age in employment or business opportunity;
- (5) Section 1101(b) of the FAST Act (Pub. L. 114-357) and 49 CFR part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in USDOT funded projects;

GREATER RVA TRANSIT VISION PLAN: NEAR-TERM STRATEGIC TECHNICAL ANALYSIS

Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization

REQUESTED ACTION: Review and provide input to the RRTPO policy board on the proposed service plan options and cost analysis of five corridor segments considered for enhanced transit in the near-term (five to seven years).

BACKGROUND: This study kicked off in May 2019. The purpose of the study is to analyze and recommend which of the high-frequency routes identified in the *Greater RVA Transit Vision Plan* (April 2017) can be implemented in the near-term with the greatest predictability of success. Of the 20 corridors slated by the original study for 20-minute or less service frequency, 12 corridors were selected through the first phase of screening. The initial screening analysis considered activity density, employment and working populations, environmental justice and transit dependent populations, existing GRTC network layout, potential near-term transit supportive development and steering committee feedback.

Findings from the second phase of analysis were reviewed and discussed with the TVP Steering Committee on December 10, 2019 and with the TAC at their meeting on January 14, 2020. The following factors were evaluated as part of this screening:

- Access to community facilities
- Walkability
- Pedestrian networks
- Roadway suitability
- Ridership potential

Based on this review, the following five corridors were recommended to move forward with more detailed capital and operating cost estimate development given alternative levels of service, analysis of return on investment and review of potential funding resources:

- Broad Street-Short Pump (Willow Lawn to Bon Secours Short Pump)
- Midlothian Turnpike (Downtown Richmond to Huguenot Road)
- West End South (Downtown Richmond to Regency Square)
- Airport via Route 60 (Downtown Richmond to RIC Airport)
- Route 1 to Ashland (Downtown Richmond to Parham Road)

The TVP Steering Committee reviewed the detailed analysis at their meeting on April 3, 2020. TAC is asked for review and comment. The summary sheets for the 12 corridors included in the initial screening can be accessed through this link:
