Current Work Efforts Update – Item A.5.a.

ConnectRVA 2045 Long-Range Transportation Plan

Staff developed the draft Vision, Guiding Principles, Goals and Objectives for the plan based on the public surveys and LRTP-Advisory Committee (AC) input and presented them to the RRTPO Policy Board on December 3. The RRTPO Policy Board authorized a public review and comment period on the draft Vision, Guiding Principles, and Goals and Objectives from December 4, 2020 through December 18, 2020, and directed staff to take all necessary steps to facilitate this review period.

Staff is also finalizing the list of regionally significant transportation projects which will be called the 'Universe of Projects'. Staff anticipate completing this list by January 2021. Staff presented the draft project scoring, ranking and prioritizing methodology to the LRTP-AC in their December meeting and anticipate getting their endorsement in January.

Ashland Trolley Line Trail Study

The Ashland Trolley Line Trail advisory group is working on the northernmost section of the recently named Fall Line trail (formerly Ashland to Petersburg). The localities along the corridor continue to identify segments of independent utility along the conceptual 14-mile route from Ashland to the City of Richmond. Several of these segments are the subject of funding applications either through the Transportation Alternatives (TA) program or SMART SCALE. The third program year of technical assistance through the National Park Service (NPS), Rivers, Trails, and Conservation Assistance Program will focus on obtaining design assistance and exploring trail management alternatives. Two story maps for the project have been developed to illustrate the importance and design potential, including history of the trolley line and a design sketchbook. Staff is planning for a January group meeting.

Regional Bicycle and Pedestrian Plan Update

The purpose of this project is to update the 2004 regional plan as a central component of the ConnectRVA2045 long range transportation plan. A <u>story map</u> of existing infrastructure, bike/ped features and statistics on bike/ped injuries and fatalities in the region continues to be updated and refined. Staff held a sixth steering committee meeting on December 8 to further review potential projects that create a regional network, present the vision, goals, objectives, and to discuss the biking Level of Stress data collected. Staff is planning for the next steering committee meeting in mid-January.

Ashland Complete Streets Pilot Project

Complete streets guidelines, or a "tool-box" of resources, depicted through graphic and photographic examples are being prepared to serve as implementation support for the regional bike/ped plan. These images are intended to show specific locations where good standards have been implemented and where infrastructure improvements could incorporate complete streets elements for better solutions throughout the region. The illustrated <u>story map</u> is available for review and continues to be updated.

Active Transportation Work Group (ATWG)

Staff was not able to assemble a December meeting for the ATWG but hopes to schedule a January meeting and put together a full calendar of four meetings for 2021. Staff participated in the November meeting for the Henrico County Active Transportation Work Group, which is designed to advise the planning for a bicycle and pedestrian chapter of the county comprehensive plan. Henrico staff shared their document review for their planning, gave updates on bicycle and pedestrian projects in the county and on the work being done for the county's comprehensive plan.

Public Transportation Work Group

The next RRTPO Public Transportation Work Group meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, January 5, 2021 and will be a virtual meeting to begin work with the GRTC consultant on the Regional Public Transportation Plan.

Vision Zero Work Group

The next RRTPO Vision Zero Work Group meeting is scheduled for Thursday, January 14, 2021 and will be a virtual meeting to begin work with VDOT and their consultant on a regional action plan.

- Developed agenda packages for the RRTPO Policy Board, Technical Advisory Committee, and Community Transportation Advisory Committee.
- Met virtually with CTAC Chair Robert Basham on November 9 to review and finalize the agenda for the November 19 CTAC meeting.
- Participated in the November 9 virtual meeting of the VAMPO Board of Directors. Among
 the topics discussed were the Federal transportation reauthorization legislation, changes
 to NEPA, the state and federal human service grant application cycles, and ideas,
 interests and needs for future VAMPO programming.
- Developed the staff report of the November 19 CTAC meeting for inclusion in the December TPO and TAC agenda packets
- Participated in the November 19 PlanRVA webinar. The program featured a panel discussion of background of the Emergency Management Alliance of Central Virginia, the role of PlanRVA in supporting the work of the alliance, and the value of the alliance to local emergency management programs. The program also included a discussion of a partnership with the Community Foundation that had resulted in the creation of a COVID-19 Response Fund.
- Prepared a spreadsheet summarizing all completed COVID-19 related training sessions for the period from March-November 2020.
- Participated in the November 30 virtual general staff meeting. In addition to reports on recent work activities, thoughts and views regarding the COVID-19 pandemic and returning to the workplace were offered. Administrative updates discussed included a new timekeeping system and payroll schedule; management of workplace requirements for employees to obtain the COVID-19 vaccine when it is available; and using electronic calendars to document when staff may be in the office or stepping away from work for some "mental health time."

Data, Analysis & Mapping:

- Continued collaboration with LRTP-AC and the Project Champions to develop regionally significant transportation projects within the RRTPO's Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) Boundary. The product will be a streamlined list of transportation projects which will be called the Universe of Projects. Staff anticipate completing the list by the end of the year.
- Continued groundwork and participation in the internal staff meetings to develop various tasks for the LRTP project development, project prioritization process, performance measures, accessibility tool, environmental justice analysis, document development and website maintenance.
- Participated in the November 4 virtual meeting of the Long-Range Transportation Public Engagement Committee. Among the topics discussed were the document design and configuration, page limits, use of icons, and inclusion of website content. As an example of a means of obtaining public input, it was suggested that members of the Committee access and view a City of Richmond website that has been created to obtain input on a multi-use trail. Followed up by suggesting that the plan include a reference to the GRTC Regional Public Transportation Plan.
- Participated in the November 5 RVA Shared Values Summit Session #2. In addition to remarks by Mark Kramer on the connections between business and philanthropy, the summit featured a panel discussion by representatives of the Robins, Richmond Memorial Health, Cameron and Community Foundations. Among the topics discussed by the speakers were community giving practices among members of Richmond's black and brown communities, building trust, having conversations about race and equity, shifting mindsets, and pursuing systemic changes.
- Participated in the November 12 RVA Shared Values Summit Session #3. The topic of the session was Accelerating Minority Business Growth and Development. The speakers addressed barriers to minority-owned business start-up, issues related to accessing business startup capital, and the challenges faced by women-owned businesses. The program also featured an overview of the Nashville Entrepreneur Center, lessons learned since establishment of the center, and next steps, which include the creation of a statewide network of entrepreneurs of color.
- Participated in the November 12 virtual meeting of the Tri-Cities MPO and prepared a
 brief summary of the MPO's discussions and decisions. The primary business items
 included an amendment to the TIP, a briefing on the status of Plan2045, and reports
 by VDRPT and VDOT.

Greater Richmond Transit Vision Plan: Near-Term Strategic Technical Analysis

A <u>story map of the recommendations</u> serves as a single reference resource for the plan adopted by the TPO Policy Board on September 3, 2020 and as an executive summary. This plan will also serve as a foundational component for the FY22 Regional Public Transportation Plan being prepared under a consultant contract by GRTC in coordination with Plan RVA as called for in the legislation establishing the Central Virginia Transportation Authority (CVTA). The story map will be shared with the Community Transportation Advisory Committee at their November meeting.

Other Transit related activities:

- Participated in the November 2 virtual meeting of the Public Transportation Work Group. The primary point of business was the presentation of two consultant proposals for the development of a regional transportation plan. Reviewed the two consultant proposals for development of a regional public transportation plan and provided comments to Adrienne Torres of GRTC
- Participated in the November 13 FTA webinar, "FTA COVID-19 Recovery Listening Session." The webinar featured a variety of speakers from federal, regional and local agencies who summarized how their organizations had adapted to the COVID-19 pandemic. Among the actions cited were new partnerships; meal, grocery and pharmacy deliveries; providing Wi-Fi access; providing non-emergency medical transportation, on-demand transportation and mobility management services; distribution of personal protective equipment to essential employees; undertaking virtual mobility planning; using additional transit vehicles to help maintain social distancing among passengers; and imposing passenger limits.
- Reviewed the following documents:
 - o Towards the Promise of MaaS in the U.S.
 - o Guidebook and Research Plan to Help Communities Improve Transportation to Health Care Services

- Participated in the November 17 virtual meeting of the GRTC Board of Directors.
- Participated in a virtual meeting with the members of a Leadership Metro Richmond (LMR) - 2021 Leadership Quest Project panel examining public transportation issues in the region. Staff began planning for a tentatively scheduled ATWG meeting in mid-December. Staff

2020 Richmond Regional Structural Inventory and Assessment Report Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization

REQUESTED ACTION: This is an information item; no action is requested.

BACKGROUND:

Bridges, culverts, and tunnels (called structures collectively) are critical building blocks of an efficient transportation system. Bridge location, design, and structural health are a key element in planning and maintaining an effective transportation network. Bridge dependability is especially important in the Richmond region due to the relatively high number of bridges in a region with numerous interstate freeways and state highways, the crossroads of three major railroad systems, and multiple major rivers and the creeks and streams that feed them. Concerned about the number of aging bridges in the region and the apparent lack of funding for maintaining or replacing them, RRTPO began tracking the condition and funding of the region's bridges since 2014.

The 2020 Richmond Regional Structural Inventory Assessment Report provides inventory of the structures in the Richmond region (i.e., Planning District 15) and includes VDOT system and non-VDOT system roads (i.e., Richmond and Ashland urban system, Henrico secondary system, RMTA, and private bridges and culverts). and identify those in poor condition (i.e., structurally deficient, weight posted, etc.). The report utilizes snapshot data captured from the online dashboard maintained by the Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) as of January 15, 2020.

The report also documents the Commonwealth's State of Good Repair (SGR) Prioritization Process Methodology for replacement and rehabilitation of structurally deficient state and locally owned bridges as adopted by the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) and include a latest prioritized list for all VDOT-owned and locality-owned bridges in the Richmond region.

The list of structures in the region which are in the poor conditions will be fed into **ConnectRVA 2045** plan as bridge replacement/rehabilitation needs within the SGR funding pot.
