The RRTPO Vision Zero Work Group meeting was held by electronic communication means as set forth by the April 22, 2020 actions of the General Assembly in response to the continued spread of novel coronavirus, or COVID-19. CALL TO ORDER

Dironna Moore Clarke, Richmond Regional Transportation Planning Organization (RRTPO) Vision Zero Work Group Chair, presided and called the January 14, 2021 RRTPO Vision Zero Work Group meeting to order at 3:04 p.m.

ATTENDANCE ROLL CALL & CERTIFICATION OF MEETING QUORUM

Nicole Mueller, Program Coordinator, took attendance by roll call and certified that a quorum was present.

1. Consideration of Amendments to the Agenda

There were no requested changes to the meeting agenda. Seeing and hearing no objections, the agenda was approved by acclamation as presented.

2. Approval of the October 8, 2020 Vision Zero Work Group Meeting Summary

On motion of Thomas M. Coleman, seconded by Sharon Smidler, the Vision Zero Work Group unanimously approved the summary of the October 8, 2020 meeting as presented. RRTPO Vision Zero Work Group Meeting Summary January 14, 2021 Page 2

3. Open Public Comment Period

There were no requests to address the work group.

4. Vision Zero Work Group Chairman's Report

Chairwoman Clarke reported on the City of Richmond Department of Public Works and partner agencies continuing Vision Zero efforts to refocus everyone on safe driving practices and to improve safety of the transportation system for all users.

5. Regional Action Plan – Guided Workshop with VDOT and VHB

At the October 8th, 2020 work group meeting, Mike Sawyer, City of Richmond Transportation Engineer, recommended using VDOT's on-call consultant to support the work group in its mission to create a regional action plan. The consultant presentation by VHB included information on the scope for the regional action plan addressing all aspects of safety through the five critical Safe System elements: safe road users, safe vehicles, safe speeds, safe design of roads, and post-crash care. VHB joined this effort to track deaths and serious injuries and develop a high injury network for the region. The consultant outlined the following proposal with a focus on data analysis:

Task 1: Project Management

- Bi-weekly Progress Calls
- Management of Budget and Schedule

Task 2: Stakeholder Engagement

- Kick-off Meeting with RRTPO Vision Zero Work Group on January 14
- Present data analysis results to the work group at the next meeting (TBD)

Task 3: Data Analysis

- Analyze 5+ years of crash data to include
 - o Summary statistics: data by year, severity, and locality
- Develop charts and maps to summarize the findings to include
 - Maps for the region and localities
 - For example, crash severities for roadway departure and intersection-related crashes
 - Connect health determinants and equity with transportation safety
 - Connect with and update Virginia Pedestrian Safety Action Plan for regional context and comparisons
 - Development of a high injury network (HIN) for the entire region and for individual localities
 - Relate HIN with health opportunity index (HOI) and VTRANS needs
 - Review overlapping contributing crash factors
- Review the metric and factors behind crashes
 - Determine the combinations of crash factors that contribute to crashes
 - o Determine prioritized locations for safety investment by locality
 - Develop dashboards as funding allows (example: <u>City of</u> <u>Richmond – Vision Zero Dashboard</u>)

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 Develop story maps to explain the magnitude of crash issues in the region

Task 4: Documentation

- Draft and final reports
- Include data visualizations in the report
- Provide geolocated crash maps

<u>Next Steps</u>: The scope of work will be modified based on the feedback of the work group. Beyond the initial scope, the next phase of this project will be to develop countermeasures to support mitigation of identified issues. In order to keep everyone informed at every stage of the project, the scope of work task timeline will be aligned with the work group meeting schedule.
